


In March, London Art Week will continue with its *Art History in Focus* series of talks and events from the 8th to 18th March. The online talks programme was developed during the first lockdown and brings academics and dealers together to discuss all aspects of pre-contemporary art reaching a growing global audience and has so far engaged with over 21,000 attendees and subsequent viewers.
